Bleachers in the gym and on the playing fields have provided adequate seating for spectators and are appreciated.




I can't wait 'till I'm a Senior Oh there are so many things I want to do. I've got four years, I'm just a Freshman.

The team plays other academies in our union and other local church teams. Mr. Byram feels that it is not important who wins the game, but how you play.


